Training schedule

Preseason training will be at Reynella East College. Training will be held at both ovals until the Cricket season finishes. Please check on Facebook or team app when pre-session times are on.

Times will change once training is back at the club. Please make sure that you follow the Reynella Facebook page for any changes.

When we are back at Reynella Oval, these times and days will change

Game Day Uniform

All players are expected to wear the following uniform to all games and from all games.

- RFC polo top or jumper
- RFC black track pants / Black Jeans / Black Chinos / Black slacks
 - If you don't have the RFC black track pants, plain black track pants are acceptable with NO stripes or logos.
- Black sneakers or shoes are to be worn with your pants.
- **Strictly NO SHORTS or Demin JEANS**

Compulsory Game gear requirements

- White SFL Shorts Away games (can be purchased through the Club)
- SFL Black football Socks (can be purchased through the Club)
- Warm up Tops – to be worn during warm up sessions

- Guernsey's are provided on Game day & to be returned to team manager after the game.

Presentations

After each round (game) all players are expected to attend game day presentations to present the top 6 SFL best on ground (BOG) for the game played. Presentations are held at the club and Hot meals will be available for sale on Saturday and Sunday. All grades that play on Saturday & Sunday will have a time slot for BOG presentations.

- **Saturday Side**

When we are playing at HOME, presentations will start at 6pm at the club. When we are playing AWAY, presentations will start at 6:30pm.

- **Sunday Side**

Sunday presentations will start at 5:30pm at the club.

All players are expected to wear the following uniform when attending presentations.

- RFC polo top or jumper
- RFC black track pants / Black Jeans / Black Chinos / Black slacks
 - If you don't have the RFC black track pants, plain black track pants are acceptable with NO stripes or logos.
- Black sneakers or shoes are to be worn with your pants.

The code of conduct's and policies will be provided to you by your team manager. You are required to sign the forms and hand it back to your team manager.

The Reynella Football Club are aware that some of the registered player's parents are separated. The RFC request all serious matters to be notified to the club, by letter, if the registered player is involved with any of the following.

- Custody of child agreement
- Any Restraining orders for the child and for any participating parents.

Your information will be confidential. Only the Coach, Team Manager and RFC officials will have access to the information you have provided. RFC has an authorised Child Protection officer and will be able to assist you if needed.

- **If you have any concerns or issues about anything to do with the team, you MUST approach the team Coordinator first and no one else. The Team Coordinator will manage all parent / Guardian communication to the coaches.**

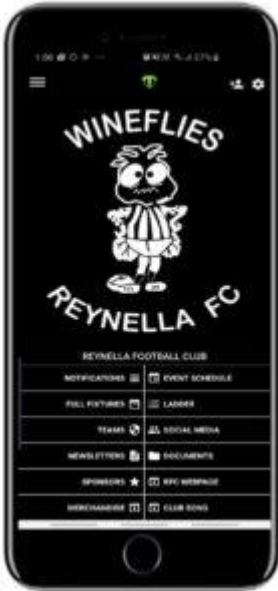
Game Day Volunteering.

Registration Information

PLAYER REGISTRATION FEES

U17.5 Player registration fees is \$380 (inc GST) per player.

Please note:

All players are registering as a Reynella player. Players are not registering to play in a Sunday or a Saturday team. Player selections for Saturday and Sunday teams will be completed by the coaching staff. Parents and players will not have the chance to choose which team they will play for.

Paying Registrations fees with the Reynella Football Club does NOT guarantee you a game during the season for every round. Registration fees covers insurances, player affiliation fees, oval hire, Equipment Hire, Footballs, Guernsey, warm up tops and the right to use the Reynella Oval and Reynella Facilities. For further clarifications please contact your direct coordinator.

The fees include:

- Compulsory Warm up tops
- Only to be worn during warm-up sessions on Gameday.
- SFL Player affiliation fee
- Reynella Community Centre player levy
- Access to club facilities
- Insurance during game time and training sessions

The Football Club also offers a part payment program through Afterpay. Please note that there is a 7% additional charge if you chose this option.

DRUG & ALCOHOL POLICY

The Reynella Football Club Drug & Alcohol Policy was created to provide guidelines and standards for ALL persons involved with RFC for the management and use of alcohol & drugs.

This policy applies to all members & supporters of the football club and all events taken upon in the football clubs name, this includes;

- ALL football Games and after game drinks in home and opposition clubrooms.
- ALL social events run or partly run by the RFC.
- ALL events which take place on a sponsor's property in the name of RFC.
- Events which take place on private property in the name of RFC.
- ALL training and associated training performed by RFC

ENFORCEMENT:

All members and supporters found in breach of the RFC Drug & Alcohol Policy will be given the benefit of the doubt and will be provided a first and final warning with regards to breaching the RFC Drug & Alcohol Policy. Upon a 2nd breach that member or supporter will be brought in front of the RFC Committee with the possibility of expulsion.

If the RFC discovers any serious habits either alcohol or drug related, the RFC will provide whatever necessary support to any member or supporter, while recommending treatment and education on the matter.

POLICY:

The Reynella Football club is committed to:

- Encouraging moderation and a responsible attitude to the consumption of alcohol.
- Minimising alcohol and other drug related harm to individuals, property and the reputation of the football club.
- Meeting legal and compliance responsibilities across the SFL

The Reynella Football club believes that:

- Members of the football club should not be affected by alcohol or drugs whilst engaged in training or game day situations.
- Members of the football club should observe local, state and federal laws in relation to using, possessing, giving or selling alcohol or drugs.
- Alcohol and drug misuse is a social and health problem, which is responsive to the prevention, and appropriate diagnosis and treatment.
- The inappropriate, irresponsible and unlawful use of alcohol and drugs can adversely affect health, safety and personal relationships and result in damage to property, and potentially affect the rights and enjoyments of others.
- All members of the football club community share a responsibility for protecting the environment by exemplifying high standards of professional and personal conduct.

- It has a legitimate interest in taking appropriate action if alcohol or drug use is adversely affecting the health safety and performance of an individual or group within the football club, or brings the football club into disrepute.

The Reynella Football club does not condone or support the use, possession, cultivation or trafficking or illicit drugs or the misuse and abuse of prescription or other medication.

The Reynella Football Club will contribute to the provision of a healthy and safe environment in relation to alcohol and drugs by:

- Encouraging moderation and a responsible approach towards the serving and consumption of alcohol.
- Ensure an inclusive environment for players and supporters who choose not to consume alcohol.
- Provide support to players and supporters who wish to address their patterns of alcohol or drug use.

The Reynella Football Club will effectively manage the risk through these policies that will:

- Outline the responsibilities of players and members
- Specify emergency procedures to be followed in the event of an adverse alcohol or drug related incident.

All incidents will be managed by the Reynella Football Club Committee

PARENT/GUARDIAN/SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

This code of conduct identifies the key principles that as a parent/guardian with the Reynella Football Club will abide by.

This Code of Conduct also outlines the Southern Football League's Parent/Spectator Rule Breach policy. The Code of Conduct provides the basis for fair play and encourages fun, friendship and a safe environment for all involved.

As a parent/guardian/spectator I agree:

- to encourage players to participate, not force them.
- to focus on the players' efforts, not winning or losing.
- to encourage players to always play according to the rules and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- to never ridicule or yell at a player for making a mistake.
- to respect the decisions of all officials and teach players to do the same.
- to recognise good performances and skillful plays by all participants.
- **NOT** to use foul language
- **NOT** to sledge or harass any players, coaches or officials.
- to Congratulate all participants on their performance regardless of the outcome of the game.
- to condemn the use of violence in any form whether it is by spectators, players, coaches or officials.
- to show respect to the opposing team.
- to show respect and appreciate the efforts of volunteer coaches, officials and administrators.
- to respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- to respect the Club's facilities & equipment
- to respect, recognise & support the voluntary contributions of all Club officials
- to support the Reynella Football Club officials in maintaining the highest standard of behavior both on and off the field for the betterment of the Club & the community

PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT

This Code of Conduct identifies the key principles that as a player with the Reynella Football Club will abide by. The Code of Conduct provides the basis for fair play and encourages fun, friendship and a safe environment for all involved.

Parents/Guardians - Please read this in conjunction with the Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct and discuss with your child if under 18.

As a player I will:

- Play by the rules.
- Never argue with an Official of the game – umpire, coach or administrator.
- Control my temper at all times.
- Never verbally abuse officials or other players.
- Not provoke my opponent.
- Work equally hard for myself and my team.
- Recognise good play whether made by a teammate or opposition player.
- Treat all participants as you would like to be treated.
- Never bully or take unfair advantage of a teammate or opposition player.
- Cooperate with my coach and teammates.
- Participate for my own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please parents and coaches.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Play the game in the correct spirit and respect the opposition team.
- Respect the history of the Reynella Football Club.

PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT

Drug and Alcohol Expectations

Always remember you are a representative of the Reynella Football Club. Accept this responsibility and always conduct yourself with a decorum which brings credit to yourself and the club.

Underage RFC players and their parents must read and sign the Drug and Alcohol policy acknowledging the importance of refraining from substance abuse. This policy also outlines the consequences if the contract agreement is not adhered to by players.

All senior and junior players may have compulsory Drug and Alcohol Education during the season which may be conducted by SA Police, Sammy D Foundation or other educators as approved by the committee.

If a player brings the club into disrepute by behaving in a poor manner whilst intoxicated or under-age drinking, disciplinary action may be taken.

The Reynella Football Club with the backing of the Reynella Sports and Social Club are a Level 2 Good Social Club and as a requirement of this accreditation the club must:

- Refuse to serve any patron who is under the age of 18, appears intoxicated or is providing alcohol to a person who has already been refused service;
- Promote designated driver practices;
- Display taxi phone numbers prominently and offer this as a free call;
- Offer food as well as alcohol whenever the bar is open;
- Provide alternative options to drinking alcohol (e.g: water, soft drinks)

SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

Policy overview and purpose

Social media is changing the way we communicate.

This policy has been developed to inform our community about using social media so people feel enabled to participate, while being mindful of their responsibilities and obligations. In particular, this policy provides practical guidance allowing all parties to benefit from the use of social media, while minimising potential risks and protecting those involved.

This policy assists to establish a culture of openness, trust and integrity in all online activities related to The Reynella Football Club.

This policy contains The Reynella Football Club guidelines for the Reynella Football Club community to engage in social media use. It also includes details of breaches of the policy.

In circumstances where guidance about social media issues has not been given in this policy, we suggest you use common sense or seek out advice from those who have approved this policy.

The Reynella Football Club is responsible for all matters related to this policy.

Coverage

This policy applies to all persons who are involved with the activities of The Reynella Football Club, whether they are in a paid or unpaid/voluntary capacity and including:

- members, including life members of The Reynella Football Club
- persons appointed or elected to The Reynella Football Club boards, committees and sub-committees;
- all employees of The Reynella Sporting and Social Club;
- all coaches and assistant coaches of The Reynella Football Club
- all official roles within all teams of The Reynella Football Club;
- all volunteers of The Reynella Football Club;
- all players of The Reynella Football Club;
- all players parents, guardians and spectators of The Reynella Football Club.

Scope

Social media refers to any online tools or functions that allow people to communicate and/or share content via the internet.

This social media policy applies to platforms including, but not limited to:

- Social networking sites (e.g. Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Google+, Pinterest, Yammer, TikTok Team App, Snapchat, WhatsApp etc)
- Video and photo sharing websites or apps (e.g. YouTube, Vimeo, Instagram, Flickr, TikTok Team App, Snapchat etc)
- Blogs and micro-blogging platforms (e.g. Tumblr, Wordpress, Blogger, etc)
- Live broadcasting apps (e.g. Periscope, Meerkat, Facebook Mentions, etc)
- Podcasting (e.g. iTunes, Stitcher, Sound cloud, etc)
- Instant messaging (e.g. SMS, Skype, Snapchat, WhatsApp, Viber, Team App, TikTok, etc)
- Public and private online forums and discussion boards
- Any other online technologies that allow individual users to upload and share content.

This policy is applicable when using social media as:

- if you are posting content on social media in relation to The Reynella Football Club that might affect The Reynella Football Club's business, products, services, events, sponsors, members or reputation.

Guidelines

You must adhere to the following guidelines when using social media related to The Reynella Football Club or its business, products, competitions, teams, participants, services, events, sponsors, members or reputation.

- ***Discrimination, sexual harassment and bullying***

The public in general, and The Reynella Football Club 's employees and members, reflect a diverse set of customs, values and points of view.

You must not post any material that is offensive, harassing, discriminatory, embarrassing, intimidating, sexually explicit, bullying, hateful, racist, sexist or otherwise inappropriate.

- ***Use common sense***

Whenever you are unsure as to whether or not the content you wish to share is appropriate, seek advice from others before doing so or refrain from sharing the content to be on the safe side.

When using social media, the lines between public and private, personal and professional, may be blurred. Remember, you are an ambassador for The Reynella Football Club.

- ***Protecting your privacy***

Be smart about protecting yourself and your privacy.

When posting content online there is potential for that content to become publicly available through a variety of means, even if it was intended to be shared privately. Therefore, you should refrain from posting any content online that you would not be happy for anyone to see, even if you feel confident that a particular individual would never see it.

Where possible, privacy settings on social media platforms should be set to limit access. You should also be cautious about disclosing your personal details.

- **Honesty**

Your honesty—or dishonesty—may be quickly noticed in the social media environment. Do not say anything that is dishonest, untrue or misleading. If you are unsure, check the source and the facts before uploading or posting anything. The Reynella Football Club recommends erring on the side of caution – if in doubt, do not post or upload.

Do not post anonymously, using pseudonyms or false screen names. Be transparent and honest. Use your real name, be clear about who you are and identify any affiliations you have.

If you have a vested interest in something you are discussing, point it out. If you make an endorsement or recommendation about something you are affiliated with, or have a close relationship with, you must disclose that affiliation.

The web is not anonymous. You should assume that all information posted online can be traced back to you. You are accountable for your actions both on and offline, including the information you post via your personal social media accounts.

- **Respect confidentiality and sensitivity**

When using social media, you must maintain the privacy of The Reynella Football Club's confidential information. This includes information that is not publically accessible, widely known, or not expected to be shared outside of The Reynella Football Club.

Remember, if you are online, you are on the record—much of the content posted online is public and searchable.

When using social media, you should be considerate to others and should not post information when you have been asked not to, or where consent has not been sought and given. You must also remove information about another person if that person asks you to do so.

Permission should always be sought if the use or publication of information is not incidental, but directly related to an individual. This is particularly relevant to publishing any information regarding minors. In such circumstances, parental or guardian consent is mandatory.

- **Gaining permission when publishing a person's identifiable image**

You must obtain express permission from an individual to use a direct, clearly identifiable image of that person.

You should also refrain from posting any information or photos of a sensitive nature. This could include accidents, incidents or controversial behaviour.

In every instance, you need to have consent of the owner of copyright in the image.

- **Avoiding controversial issues**

If you see misrepresentations made about The Reynella Football Club in the media, you may point that out to the relevant authority in The Reynella Football Club. Always do so with respect and with the facts. If you speak about others, make sure what you say is based on fact and does not discredit or belittle that party.

- ***Branding and intellectual property of The Reynella Football Club***

You must not use any of The Reynella Football Club's intellectual property or imagery on your personal social media without prior approval from The Reynella Football Club.

The Reynella Football Club's intellectual property includes but is not limited to:

- trademarks
- logos
- slogans
- imagery which has been posted on The Reynella Football Club official social media sites or website.

You must not create either an official or unofficial The Reynella Football Club presence using the organisation's trademarks or name without prior approval from The Reynella Football Club.

You must not imply that you are authorised to speak on behalf of The Reynella Football Club unless you have been given official authorisation to do so by The Reynella Football Club Senior Members.

Policy breaches

Breaches of this policy include but are not limited to:

- Using the Reynella Football Club's name, motto, crest and/or logo in a way that would result in a negative impact for the organisation, clubs and/or its members.
- Posting or sharing any content that is abusive, harassing, threatening, demeaning, defamatory or libellous.
- Posting or sharing any content that includes insulting, obscene, offensive, provocative or hateful language.
- Posting or sharing any content, which if said in person during the playing of the game would result in a breach of the rules of the game.
- Posting or sharing any content in breach of the Reynella Football Club's anti-discrimination, racial discrimination, sexual harassment or other similar policy.
- Posting or sharing any content that is a breach of any state or Commonwealth law.
- Posting or sharing any material to our social media channels that infringes the intellectual property rights of others.
- Posting or sharing material that brings, or risks bringing the Reynella Football Club's, its affiliates, its sport, its officials, members or sponsors into disrepute. In this context, bringing a person or organisation into disrepute is to lower the reputation of that person or organisation in the eyes of the ordinary members of the public.

- **Reporting a breach**

If you notice inappropriate or unlawful content online relating to the Reynella Football Club or any of its members, or content that may otherwise have been published in breach of this policy, you should report the circumstances immediately.

- **Investigation**

Alleged breaches of this social media policy will be investigated by the senior committee members of the Reynella Football Club.

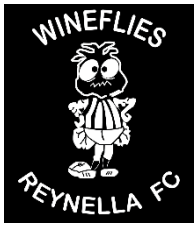
Where it is considered necessary, the Reynella Football Club may report a breach of this social media policy to police.

- **Disciplinary process & consequences**

All breaches of this policy will be dealt with in Reynella Football Club.

Consequences of the breach may include,

- Suspension of player involved.
- Suspension of parents / spectator / guardian involved.
- Deregistration of player.
- 12-month band to parents / spectator / guardian involved.
- Criminal charges may apply depending on breach.
